TRASH/DEBRIS SERVICES

Public Works regularly collects stray trash to maintain a presentable image and promote the safety of village corridors.

Areas covered and duties include the following:



- Village properties and easements
- ▲ All locales where mowing operations occur
- Portions of state and county rights-of-way
- Trash receptacles at village properties
- Debris or hazards on village, county, and state roadways

MOWING OPERATIONS

Mowing operations occur generally from April through September. These operations cover approximately 32 acres throughout the village on a weekly basis. Mowing operations include:

- String trimming
- Backpack blowing
- Stray trash pick-up

BRANCH CHIPPING

The Public Works branch chipper is a true, all-season workhorse. Scheduled chipping runs were made weekly as a village service. Additionally, our tree removal and tree and brush trimming services also require branch chipper usage.



With the exception to some heavier winds, nature spared our village of heavy-duty debris clean up. However, we assisted the village of Justice in debris clean up after an EF-1 tornado touched down within its village limits.

TREE and BRUSH SERVICES



A variety of tasks fall into the mix of our tree, brush, and trimming services conducted on village properties and easements. Our arsenal of power tools and our crew can own up to those tasks.

Such tasks include the following:

- Tree or tree limb removals
- Trimming road shoulder and sidewalks for improved sight lines and safety
- ▲ General brush trimming and pruning to maintain a pleasing appearance

LANDSCAPING

Landscaping is important to maintain the curb appeal of our village. Many of the plantings and floral adornments have been established and maintained by the Public Works landscape crew.

Landscaping includes the following duties:

- Flora cultivation and preservation at our greenhouse
- Planting/transplanting
- Weeding/watering
- Mulching and soil enhancement
- Edging, trimming, pruning

Our projects also include hardscaping. Some of those projects are detailed here:

Drainage Channel Improvement (8318 Archer Avenue)



- Project completed entirely by Public Works
- Removal of decrepit chain link fence
- Thinning of brush/tree overgrowth
- Installation of decorative metal fence

Willowshire Entrance (Stratford Drive at Wolf Road)



- Project was contracted locally but aided by Public Works
- Removal of Willowshire sign and all existing landscaping, soils, and paver blocks
- Installation of decorative landscape lighting
- Addition of native shrubs, grasses, and tree
- Addition of flagstone & refreshed mulch
- Reinstallation of Willowshire sign

- Under-eave lighting at the pavillion
- Border and layout improvements
- Floral improvements at the "V"

VILLAGE FACILITY PROJECTS

This year presented many opportunities to update and upgrade portions of our village facilities and properties. Many projects were completed by Public Works staff while others were coordinated through contract work. Each project enhanced the appearance, accessibility, and sustainability of village assets. Presented below are some of the noteworthy improvements which occurred in 2024.

Community Center



- Updated lighting and ceiling fans in main hall and balconies
- New tile flooring in main hallway and the kitchen
- Painting of Senior Club office
- Cleaning, storage installation, and painting of janitorial closet
- Replacement of all furnace units
- Roof repairs
- Restroom fixture updates to include installation of baby changing stations



Dog Parks



- Installation of new dog waste bag bins
- Removal of decaying trees in small dog park; replaced with three native trees

- Layout improvements in the foyer
- Installation of decorative ceiling tile and light fixtures in the classroom display area

- Installation of new basketball backboards, rims, and nets

LEAF COLLECTION



The leaf crews and our two leaf vacuum trailers stood up to autumn's annual test! Leaf collection runs were conducted on a daily/near-daily basis—to include concurrent operation of both leaf vacuum trailers in different areas of the village.

Leaf collection consists of tending to these areas:

- Residences
- Storm sewer manholes
- Village owned properties and easements
- Street curb lines

SIGNAGE and LIGHTING

Public Works maintains a variety of roadway signs and illumination systems. Some of the 2024 highlights include the following:

- ▲ Installation of multiple "No Truck" signs on village street junctions with Archer Avenue
- Restriping of parking stalls on Market Street
- New LED lighting at Village Business Parking (old Metra) lot
- New LED lighting at Willow Park
- ▲ 100% replacement of road signs and posts on Forest Woods Drive

ROADWAY MAINTENANCE

Various roadway projects occurred during 2024. Many improvements, resurfacing, and patchwork repairs involved budgeted/contracted work as well as I-294 Tollway Project Restoration work (detailed below).

Budgeted / Contracted Street Resurfacing and Improvements







- 85th Street west of Wolf Road
- Park Street and new parking lanes at Lions Park
- Vinewood Avenue between Elm and Hilton Streets
- Total lane mileage resurfaced: 3840 feet
- Total footage of patchwork repairs: 3800 square feet

I-294 Restoration Project (Resurfacing)





- Willow Boulevard from 8700
 Archer Avenue to the main Metra parking lot
- Total lane mileage:1800 feet
- Village Business (old Metra)
 Parking Lot
- Total footage: 40,075 square feet

Budgeted / Contracted Street Resurfacing and Improvements



- Sealcoating and restriping of parking lots at the Village Hall and both Metra lots
- Total footage: 45,738 square feet

Public Works crews also performed various roadway projects, facilitated by use of our Falcon Hotbox asphalt trailer. Such projects included pothole repair, cut-and-patch projects, and application of roadway crack sealant.

SANITARY and STORM SYSTEMS

To ensure smooth operations and services, our crew performs checks, preventative maintenance, repairs, and service calls throughout our vast sanitary and storm systems. We monitor and maintain the following:



- Six sanitary sewage lift stations
- More than 30 miles of sanitary sewer lines



50-plus miles of storm sewer lines,culverts, and pond or ditch inlets and outlets

Some of the 2024 projects and additional improvements include the following:

♣ Park Street storm sewer	Replacement of a 100-foot section of deteriorated line
♣ Renaissance Lift Station	Installation of two new pumps
▲ Kean Avenue Lift Station	Installation of new floats, purchase and installation of a refurbished pump
▲ Sanitary sewer camera inspections	Approximately 25% of sanitary sewer lines have been inspected for damage or flow-related issues
▲ Sanitary sewer line repairs	Two segments repaired after discovery of gas service line penetration in the sanitary line (100 block of South Nolton)

WINTER WEATHER OPERATIONS



The 2023-2024 winter season was a relatively mild season, yet our crew rolled out to pre-treat roads for winter conditions and/or conduct full snow removal operations.

While we still apply road salt, we have shifted toward brine and/or liquid solutions for ice prevention and de-icing. This is cost effective, and it is less intrusive to stormwater/meltwater drainage systems and their outlets. Our liquid solution supply station capacity stands at 6000 gallons.

We have upgraded our liquid anti-ice/de-ice capability to the Boss model VSI 1000 system. This 1,000-gallon tank sprayer system supplements our 600-gallon application system. The VSI 1000 allows for automated dispensation—meaning it can apply more material on inclines, declines, and at intersections, while regulating a lesser flow on areas with little to no incline.

We maintain approximately:

- ▲ 25 miles of streets and alleys
- ♣ 4.6 miles of pedestrian passageways
- 4 miles of village-owned properties (i.e.: parking lots and entrances)

We continue to monitor our solar-powered weather station (with



camera and road temperature sensor)

located on Glenwood Avenue. Manufacturer-end enhancements to the system enable weather- and surface-related textual alerts to key Public Works staff, thus expanding our ability to monitor such conditions.
