I would like to take this opportunity to wish everyone a happy and healthy new year. I hope you have noticed the outstanding job our public works has performed throughout 2018. Public Works Director Keith Grantland and his crew are hard at work every day.

Village Administrator, Brent Woods, is responsible for the day to day operations of the village at all levels. Brent is readily available to address any matters that need your attention.

Our Police Chief, Jim Ritz, has over 30 years of law enforcement service and is an adjunct faculty member at a local community college, in their criminal justice program. Chief Ritz is very proactive and is always searching for ways to increase training for the men and women serving our police department.

Village Clerk Mary Jane Mannella is responsible for the village hall staff and is our appointed board member to the West Suburban Water Commission. Village Clerk Mannella is active with our senior residents and all of our community events. We are always looking for volunteers to assist our staff with various events. Our Willow Fest carnival and fireworks event was a huge success coupled with the annual car show. All of this was possible with donations and revenue generated by the carnival and car show entries as well. This year we hope to increase the number of available carnival rides and expand on our spectacular fireworks show the weekend of August 8-11.

The elected board of trustees is committed to monitoring village spending and increasing revenue. We are currently compiling and reviewing data for our annual budget for Fiscal Year 2019-2020.

At present, we are in the process of working with a developer that will make a significant investment in our fine village. A residential community will soon replace the former Willowbrook Ballroom site. A mix of condominium units and townhomes will take shape under the name of Willow Glen. The proposal calls for over two-hundred units as well as a club house. We hope to have a ground breaking in the spring of 2019.

If you are having work done to the inside or outside of your home, please adhere to village permit and code requirements.

- Construction hours: Monday Saturday 7:00 a.m. to 7 p.m. and Sunday 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- **Permits:** A permit is required for <u>all</u> construction including the following common projects fences, dump-sters, roofs, windows and exterior doors, siding, gutters, soffit, fascia installation, decks, patios, swimming pools, sheds, driveways, sidewalks, underground drainage, electrical, plumbing and all interior and exterior remodeling projects. If you are unsure whether a permit is required, please call the village hall at 708-467-3700.

Application Requirements:

- **Application**: Fill out completely. Applications can be found on the Village website or picked up at the Village Hall.
- Plat of Survey: Please submit a plat of survey with all permits for new construction, additions, and accessory structures, including replacing patios, decks and driveways. Plat of survey should be current and reflect all existing structures on the property. Permit applications submitted without a plat of survey will not be approved.
- **Site Plan**: Site plans are required for all new construction, additions and accessory structures, drawn to scale with the building dimensions noted. The site plan can be shown on the plat of survey.
- Engineering/Grading Plan: Engineering/grading plans are required for new construction or for any permit that will be disturbing the soil; for example, large patios, in ground swimming pools or major landscaping. Engineering/grading plans will be reviewed by the Village engineer for storm water management compliance. Engineering review fees are paid by the building permit applicant.
- **Copy of Contract or Estimate**: A copy of the contract or estimate of the project detailing the scope of work and the cost of the job must be turned in with the permit application.
- **Contractor's License**: All contractors are required to be listed on the permit application and be registered with the Village. Permits will not be issued when a contractor is not registered or their license has expired. Contactor's licenses expire yearly on December 31.
- J.U.L.I.E.: Upon receive your permit, call J.U.L.I.E. at 811 or (800) 892-0123 and they will schedule a visit to your property to mark the location of all underground utilities.

- **Permit Card**: Your permit card must be displayed in a window or door that faces the street and is unobstructed. Failure to display the permit card may result in a fine. Permit cards are valid for one year from date of issuance.
- **Inspections**: Inspections are required on all work performed. The property owner/contractor is responsible for obtaining all inspections. It is recommended that a homeowner does not make their final payment to their contractor until a final inspection has been completed and approved. This protects the homeowner by ensuring the contractor has done the work according to the plans approved by the Village. Inspections must be scheduled 48 hours in advance by dropping off the completed inspection card at the Village Hall. Failure to schedule inspections will result in fines.

Book on over to the Indian Prairie Public Library in Darien to get a library card for a discounted rate!



- Willow Springs' residents may now purchase a library card for your household for \$151 a year. The regular non-resident rate is \$201, but the Village of Willow Springs entered into an agreement with the Indian Prairie Public Library to pick up \$50 of that cost. This card entitles you to all services provided by IPPL, plus you may use the card at other libraries.
- Your card is good for one year.

Public Works Update

Leaf pickup ended on December 28th. There will not be any more leaf pick up until next fall. You can always dispose of leaves by placing them in a brown recycling bag and with a yard waste sticker and our refuse company will pick it up. Branch pickup will continue throughout the winter.

Electronic recycling drop off is at the Public Works Department on Monday – Friday from 8 am to 3 pm. You must check in at the public works office or the police department and bring an ID showing you are a resident. Acceptable items include: televisions, CRT monitors, LCD monitors, computers, laptops, printers, fax machines, copiers, VCRs, keyboards and mice, DVD players, microwaves, stereos, speakers, cable cords, telephones, cell phones, game consoles, and handheld devices (iPods, CD players, etc.).

We do not accept typewriters, terminals, toaster ovens, hair dryers, curling irons, cash registers, UPS batteries, refrigerators, stoves, dishwashers, dryers, electronic tools, vacuums and washing machines.


If you are trying to contact public works, please send an email to kgrantland@willowsprings-il.gov or call the Village Hall at 708-467-3700 and leave a message.

Please be advised that there is no parking on Village streets after two inches of snowfall. Senior citizens must call in to register for driveway apron snow removal. Remember, this will take place one to two days after snow fall. Even if you were on the list last year, you must re-register by calling the Village Hall.

Shoveling or plowing snow onto village streets is against the law and residents could be issued a citation.

This is not only dangerous for the snow plow drivers, but also for motorists. Snowplows cannot direct snow away from mailboxes or driveways. It is the responsibility of the homeowner to clear all snow away from mailboxes to ensure timely delivery. Please make sure that any fire hydrant in front of your property is clear of snow and visible in case of an emergency.

Spring cleanup day will be on April 27th. Please gather up your neighbors and friends and call the village hall to sign up for this worthwhile event. Let's get together and make Willow Springs shine!

Thanks to everyone who came out and enjoyed a great open house event.






