

Tail End of Tornado Tears Through Town!

Spring 2021 concluded with the tail end of an EF3 tornado ripping through parts of the Village as well as other towns to the west. We are very grateful that there were no casualties or injuries to any of our residents. Unfortunately, our Public Works complex suffered minor damage and hundreds of trees were toppled or ravaged throughout our Village. Pearl Street and Nolton, north of Archer, were particularly affected suffering the loss of many beautiful trees. Thankfully, Keith Grantland and his public works crew jumped into action shortly after the storm passed and began a large cleanup effort with the help of neighboring towns of Summit, Justice, McCook, Lyons and the Township of Lyons. This effort is expected to last a few weeks. Please note, Public Works cannot remove trees from residents' front, side or back yards or the ComEd Easement. All branches must be placed on the easement in the front of your property for pickup.

LIFT STATION UPDATE

In early May we had a lift station go down in Fairway Club 2. We spent many hours there trying to get it back in service. We finally got one pump up and running by removing many flushable wipes calling out a Vactor truck to vacuum a layer of wipes off the floor of the lift station. One pump was unrepairable because the wipes cracked the housing for the impeller and it had to be replaced. This repair cost the Village almost \$7,000.00. **PLEASE DO NOT FLUSH ANY KIND OF WIPES DOWN THE TOILET! THE ONLY THING THAT SHOULD BE FLUSHED IS TOILET PAPER!!!!!!**

PUBLIC WORKS NEW EQUIPMENT

Public works is starting to put our new equipment into full use. Our hot patch trailer is out around town repairing pot holes and small sections of road. The hot patch trailer is like a giant oven that keeps the patching material at 200 degrees. Keeping the material at that temperature makes a pothole repair more permanent over cold patch which only last a couple months.



The new Caterpillar backhoe arrived in mid-May. We waited almost 10 months for it to be built to our specifications with the attachments that include a 12ft snow pusher, 4ft ditching bucket, rear thumb, forks, and a 4 in 1 bucket. We went almost a year without a backhoe which prevented us from doing some projects around town. A new pickup truck has also arrived to replace our older unreliable vehicle.

NEW LANDSCAPING

Public works and the beautification commission have worked together to add landscaping around the village sign on Market St, the village rock on Willow Blvd, the Liberty Grove entrance sign, and Legacy Park.



There are more projects to come in the fall.

Public works is also working on changes to the front landscaping at the police department. We have removed the islands of wood chips near the village hall area and replaced them with sod.

YARD WASTE

Yard waste may be disposed of during our weekly garbage collection. You must place your yard waste (weighing no more than 50 lbs per bag) into disposal brown paper bags (your own or store purchased landscape bags) next to your garbage and recycling carts. Each paper bag must be tagged with a yellow Willow Springs yard waste sticker. Stickers are available at the Village Hall for \$2.50 per sticker. Another option is to rent a yard waste cart for the season (April 1-December 15) for \$100.00 to be utilized in the weekly garbage collection. To rent a yard waste cart from Lakeshore Recycling Systems, which recently acquired from Roy Strom Company, please call customer service at 773 207-5516 or email them at

customer.service@LRSrecycles.com. Please do not burn yard waste, garbage and debris. It is illegal and bad for your health and the environment. Now more than ever we need clean air to breath to protect our immune systems and keep our lungs functioning well.

Beautification Commission News

The Village of Willow Springs Beautification Commission came up with great ideas for the Spring season kick-off and we discovered that it truly takes a Village to see them through!

The Commission paid tribute to Earth Day on Saturday, April 24, with an event powered by 45 volunteers, including Boy Scouts from Bridgeview. Everyone worked their magic cleaning up Lyons Park, the Historic Bus Stop, the Veterans Corner, and the corner of Willow Springs Road and Archer. In addition, they weeded and cleaned the Legacy Garden Park beds and enlarged the Butterfly Garden there.



The following weekend, armed with plans created by landscape architect Dina Fowler, sixteen volunteers planted more than 150 plants at three different locations prepared by the Public Works Department, including the area around the electronic sign on Market Street, the boulder on Willow Blvd., and the entrance to the Liberty Grove subdivision. The plans also call for the entrance to Willow on the Hill will be planted in the Fall.

Residents needing a handicap placard must have the Disability Placard Application issued by Secretary of State Jesse White signed by their physician. Residents can then be issued a 90-day temporary placard by the Township Clerk's office. This service is free to township residents. After obtaining the temporary placard, the application should be mailed to the Secretary of State's Office in Springfield, IL.

Summertime Safety Tips

The Willow Springs Police Department encourages you to follow these summer safety tips as recommended by the National Safety Council:

Bicycling / Motorcycles:

Cyclists—Check Your Equipment!

Always inspect your bike prior to riding

The seat should be adjusted to the proper height and locked in place

Make certain all parts are secure and working properly

Check that the tires are inflated properly

Make sure the bike is equipped with reflectors on the rear, front, pedals and spokes

A horn or bell, a rear-view mirror and a bright headlight also are recommended

Make certain drivers can see you, especially at night!!

Wear neon, fluorescent or other bright clothing

If you must ride at night, wear reflective clothing and use flashing lights

Do not wear dark clothing at night

Wear an appropriate helmet

Skateboarding:

Always inspect your skateboard before your ride to make certain it is in good working order.

Your skateboard should be free of loose, broken or cracked parts, sharp edges on metal boards and a slippery top surface

According to the [American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons](#), this essential protective equipment should be worn when skateboarding:

Protect Yourself – Wear the Right Equipment

Properly fitted multi-sport helmet meeting [Consumer Product Safety Commission standards](#)

Close-toed, slip-resistant shoes

Wrist guards

Knee pads

Elbow pads

Goggles or glasses

Fireworks:

Never use illegal fireworks – they are illegal for a reason!

Never allow young children to handle fireworks

Older children should use them only under close adult supervision

Never use fireworks while impaired by drugs or alcohol

Never hold lighted fireworks in your hands

Only use them away from people, houses and flammable material

Never point or throw fireworks at another person

Never ignite devices in a container

Do not try to re-light or handle malfunctioning fireworks

Summertime Safety Tips Continued

Heat Related Exposure:

Use sunscreen

Drink lots of water to stay hydrated

Limit physical activity during the hottest peak hours of the day to reduce risk of heat exhaustion and heat-stroke.

Pedestrians:

Cell phone [distracted walking](#) is a huge problem, and rarely are we more vulnerable than when walking, crossing streets and negotiating traffic. Pay attention to your surroundings!


June 2021 News

KEEP POOL SAFETY IN MIND

- Have safety rules and make sure everyone knows them.
- Keep children away from filter inlets.
- Make sure children can swim or wear flotation devices.
- Ensure that a responsible adult supervises children at all times.
- Evacuate the pool during a thunderstorm.
- Do not allow glass or sharp objects near the pool.
- Don't swim alone.
- Don't allow adults who have been drinking alcohol into the pool area. Alcohol and swimming don't mix.
- Install fencing to keep people out of the pool without your knowledge.

POOL SAFETY CHECKLIST

- Have a cell phone in the pool area and post emergency numbers nearby : **911**
- Collect toys from the pool at the end of each day, so that children don't wander after them.
- Make sure that at least one adult supervisor in the pool area knows CPR.
- Remove anything near a pool's fence that children could climb on to get into the pool.
- When leaving the pool area, make sure all gates, locks, safety covers and alarms are working.



BEACH SAFETY AND RIP CURRENTS

Observe swim advisories and swim near lifeguards.
Inexperienced swimmers should wear flotation devices.
Use sunscreen that is at least SPF 15.
Learn to recognize RIP CURRENTS and avoid them.
RIP CURRENTS pull people from the shore.
RIP CURRENTS account for 80% of beach rescues.
Don't swim into a known RIP CURRENT.
If caught in a RIP CURRENT, yell for help, relax and swim parallel to the shore until you're out of the RIP CURRENT.

Note: Outside of Township: Please schedule an appointment between 9:30-1:30 to ensure they can get you there on time and picked up afterwards.

Pickup Times:

- Medical appointments may be picked up 1 hour before schedule.
- Times may vary due to busy route, location, unavoidable delays, etc.
- They will keep you informed of any changes, delays in pick up times.

They will give you a courtesy call 10-15 minutes before your bus arrives to pick you up.
