A MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR


Dear Residents,

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

Greetings and Reminders to All,

As we transition to the fall season, please note that the scheduled branch pick-up will end on September 27th and leaf pickup will begin in November. Leaf pickup is for leaves only. Please DO NOT add any other yard waste materials such as grass clippings, pine needles, branches, flowers or vegetation to your leaf piles.

Public works has had a busy summer patching pot holes, trimming trees, maintaining our parks and public areas, and planting flowers. One of the larger projects that we recently completed is the beautification of the three large flower beds at the North end of the Willow Springs Road bridge area close to the bike and walking paths. We are happy to announce that we have set up our new sewer department service truck that was delivered in July. It includes a sewer camera, generator and mounted crane to assist us in maintaining our village sewer lift station pumps.

The fall season is a busy time for us, we will be working to get our plow and salt trucks ready for the winter. With that being said, we would like to put out the following reminders:

- 1.) Ordinance 2022-O-04 Snow Removal: It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle on any public street in the Village at any time within twelve (12) hours after a snowfall of two (2) inches or more has occurred.
- 2.) Public works cannot be called to clear snow from private property or driveways.
- 3.) Public works is not responsible for roll-over snow on driveways and sidewalks created by plowing.
- 4.) Please DO NOT shovel roll-over snow or any other snow back into the streets.

Public works would like to welcome our new assistant director Paul Freyman. Paul replaces Steve Werner who retired earlier this year. Paul comes to us with 25 years of public works experience and he is a great addition to our team of professional public works employees.

Hello Willow Springs!

It has been such a great pleasure getting to know this welcoming community. I can't believe it has been six months already. Time is flying by, so much has happened!

I first met with each of the trustees to get a sense of their concerns regarding public safety. I then met with each of our supervisors to understand the inner workings of our department and it's challenges. At the same time, I had to become recertified as a police officer in Illinois. That involved a one hundred and fifteen hour on line course, a two hundred question multiple choice test, and four hour firearms qualification. I'm glad that is over.

We hired another full time officer (Anthony Vosicky), and certified a new police officer list for future hires.

Bluesfest was a great success, but Willowfest has been my favorite. I really got to meet our community there. The food and music were great, and it was difficult to get my five year old son off of the rides!

On a much more somber note, on September 11, I delivered a keynote speech at a memorial event, sponsored by McCook, Willow Springs and other local jurisdictions. It was difficult for me to recount my experiences at The World Trade Center, but I received the same enormous support that I have felt since arriving in Willow Springs.

Finally, I would like to thank Mayor Neddermeyer and our Trustees for voting to make me official as the Chief of Willow Springs Police on September 8! I was sworn in by Mr. Sprinkle, and am honored to serve you all in my new position!

The Beautification Commission is bidding farewell to a summer of projects fulfilled and fundraising to make them possible.

The Willow on the Hill subdivision entrance project is complete. Residents are grateful for a more inviting welcome to their neighborhood.

Gardeners at Legacy Garden Park occupied every box available and continue to enjoy the fruits of their labor. Many gathered on Wednesday, August 24 for a presentation by Commissioner Beth Piersialla about the magnificent pollinators, Monarch Butterflies. The highlight of the evening was the release of a Monarch into the Legacy Garden Park Butterfly Garden.

We received some exciting news recently that we have been awarded a ComEd Openlands Matching Grant of more than \$9,000 to expand and enhance the Legacy Garden Park into an established pollinator habitat to support native pollinator species. The grant will make possible educational signage and areas for education and relaxation to enjoy in the Park. Plans are in the works for the erection of a gazebo and installation of a walking path. The Legacy Garden Park offers an outstanding opportunity for residents to experience the joy of raising plants and learning about the natural species beautifying our Village landscape.

We will be erecting two new Little Libraries constructed by Kiley Mahoney, a Girl Scout earning the Gold Award, the highest award in Girl Scouting. One Library will be placed at the gazebo at Healing Waters Park and the other along the walking path in the Windings of Willow Ridge. Our thanks to Kiley for making a lasting contribution to our Village!

The event we all look forward to when winter cabin fever sets in is Not So Serious Bingo, which we plan to sponsor on the weekend of January 28-29, 2023. Please watch for news about the dates and times.

The Beautification Commission's major fundraising project, "Paving the Way for History," enables residents to take a stroll through history as you read the bricks in the Village Hall walkway, placed to honor and memorialize those who have contributed to the vibrant community we enjoy. You can join us! Bricks are available for purchase in support of this project. Please check out the application on the Village website and on social media. Your donation of \$125.00 per brick ensures your place in history.

In November we will be having our Senior Bake Sale lots of home made goodies-all calories removed during Election Day November 8th. Also in November we will be holding elections for our board members.


Christmas is coming fast & we've already reserved our place for food & fun at Royalty West on December 20th.

HISTORICAL SOCIETY NEWS


