PUBLIC WORKS



Public works would like to welcome our new Village Administrator, Ryan Grace, to Willow Springs. Ryan was a previous Public Works director and his background in public works will be a huge asset to our village. During last year's tornado clean up, Ryan and his crew from Lyons helped our community clean up storm damage. He has also assisted Willow Springs with other projects such as street sweeping and helping with the set-up for Willow Fest.

In December, Public Works took delivery of a new Ford F550 dump truck equipped with a snow plow and salt spreader. With this truck, we now will run two salt trucks simultaneously on each side of the town during winter storms.

Public Works has hired a new seasonal part-time employee with a background in plant and flower care this summer. This employee will maintain all the flowering areas around the village. We are very excited to see our public space get the special attention it deserves.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

WILLOW SPRINGS POLICE DEPARTMENT TEAMS UP WITH THE NATIONAL CENTER FOR MISSING AND EXPLOITED CHILDREN (NCMEC)

The Willow Springs Police Department has teamed up with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children in their Missing Children's Readiness Program (MKRP). The MKRP training program promotes best practices for taking and responding to calls of missing and sexually exploited children. As part of the training, every police officer on our department must go through the online training program. All of our officers will complete the MECINTRO and MECPAT training modules. With all of our officers completing the NCMEC program, the Willow Springs Police Department will receive a Certificate of Membership and Award for placement of our department as an active MKRP member. We will also be recognized and placed on the NCMEC website and social media platforms signifying our department as a MKRP member. This certification process provides great training for our officers when handling calls for missing or exploited children. The Willow Springs Police Department is proud to be recognized and work in partnership with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children.

DEA TASK FORCE RECOGNITION

The Willow Springs Police Department is proud to recognize the outstanding efforts of our assigned DEA Task Force Officer and their group. Thanks to the hard work and efforts taken, we were rewarded with a number of asset disbursement awards totaling over \$139,000.00 to enhance our continued drug enforcement initiatives. Also, due to the efforts of our task force officer, we currently have over \$200,000.00 in pending asset awards for possible disbursements to our department.

WILLOW SPRINGS COMMUNITY ALERT – CYBERATTACKS AND MOBILE PHONE ATTACKS

With the recent developments of Russia and Ukraine, there has been a significant uptick in cyberattacks from Russia. Many businesses and most home users DO NOT have geographical filters in place to block certain countries and locations.

Please be very careful when opening emails. Confirm the send from email address (not just the name) and also hover over links to confirm they are from a legitimate source. If you are not sure, delete the email and contact the sending party or access your portal (bank, email, etc.) to confirm no pending alerts on any of your accounts.

Mobile Phone Attacks

The FBI has recently sent out alerts and warnings concerning surges in schemes to break into your mobile phones in order to nab money from your bank account. These sophisticated scams hijack your mobile phone number and gain access to your money accounts.

The Willow Springs Police Department has handled calls of this nature, so please take extra precautions to protect your electronic devices and your personal information.



The reconditioning and painting project of the High Tank located at High Street and Forest Ave is ready to start! On March 21st, 2022 the high tank will be completely drained and taken out of service for approximately 11 weeks. The high tank is responsible for maintaining the water supply and pressures within the Village of Willow Springs. Without the high tank in service the Commission will be interconnected with the Village of Burr Ridge to supply water to the Community eliminating the Commission from pumping or pressure adjustments. During this time water pressures may vary and may not be as high as you are used to but there is no need of concern of boil orders or water quality issues. We ask for your patience and understanding during this project. The high tank is a vital part of the water system and this work is needed to ensure it remains in great working condition for years to come! BEAUTIFICATION COMMISSION



Throughout the long, dreary Winter months, the Beautification Commission has made lofty plans for when Spring finally arrives. The time has come!

First is the opening of the Legacy Garden Park, 105 Kazwell, Willow Springs, on May 1. Applications will be taken beginning March 1 for the 14 low-lying spaces and four accessible spaces. What better way to supplement your garden space and spend time enjoying nature and meeting neighbors? Plans call for the enlargement of the butterfly garden to add to the beauty of our community space.

Community Outreach Programs to inform and educate residents on topics related to gardening will once again be held at Legacy Garden Park. There will be a zoom presentation on April 6 at 6pm on designing butterfly gardens. Check the Beautification Facebook page for more information. Future programs will be announced as they are planned.

The Beautification Commission fundraising project "Paving the Way for History" has begun with the installation of the first group of bricks in the walkway leading to the Village Hall. Purchasing a brick or two is a wonderful way to honor a special person or memorialize a loved one. You may have noticed the Little Libraries installed at the historic Bus Stop, Village Hall and the Community Center. Have you browsed the selections and perhaps donated books you may have already read? You will find interesting titles for adults and children just waiting to be enjoyed again.

We have exciting news to share! We will add two new Little Libraries to Willow Springs this summer! Kiley Mahoney of Troop #50738, a sophomore at Lyons Township High School, will construct the Little Libraries in fulfillment of the Girl Scout Gold Award, the highest award in Girl Scouting encouraging Senior Scouts and Ambassadors to develop and carry out lasting solutions to their neighborhoods and beyond. We are thrilled Kiley's project will benefit the residents of Willow Springs by providing convenient access to interesting reading materials for all.

Looking ahead, plans call for multiple, ever-popular bingo sessions sponsored by the Beautification Commission at Willow Fest, August 11-14. Please watch for dates and times.

Finally, a Community Shredding Event will be held Saturday, September 17 from 9am to 12 noon in the Metra lot west of the Village Hall. Pack up all the documents you would like shredded free of charge and enjoy doughnuts and coffee with us. We look forward to seeing you!

VEHICLE STICKERS GO ON SALE APRIL 1ST!

Every car housed in the Village is required to purchase a vehicle sticker, even if your car is not registered to Willow Springs, is leased, or is a company car – you still need a vehicle sticker. Vehicle stickers are not transferable from one town to another, and new residents have 30 days from their closing date to purchase a sticker. Vehicle stickers are due by June 30 of each year and must be displayed on your windshield in the lower passenger side before July 1. Late fees will apply immediately after June 30.



LRS has acquired Roy Strom, but the Roy Strom crews are still servicing you!

Please remember to have all material set out by 6am on your collection day. There are times when the regular drivers are out and you may see new drivers at different times of the day.

Did you know Roy Strom/LRS will collect one bulk item per week for no charge? Bulk items are items that are too large to fit into your garbage container. Examples of bulk item include a table, chair, mattress, bed frame, box spring, large pictures, or frames, (4) carpet rolls or up to (4) containers of home project debris.

Oversized items or appliances that may need two or more people to lift will require a special pick up. To schedule a special pick up please contact Roy Strom/LRS at (708) 344-5000.

Yard Waste season is just around the corner! Beginning April 1st – December 31st Roy Strom/LRS will continue to collect brown yard waste bags or bundles set out with Willow Springs Yard Waste Stickers attached. NEVER PAY A UTILITY BILL LATE FEE AGAIN!

Say what? That's right! If you sign up for direct debit, you will never pay a late fee again!

What is direct debit?

Direct debit, also known as automatic transfer, authorized withdrawal, and auto-pay, is when a bill payer authorizes another party—such as an insurance company, utility, landlord, etc.—to withdraw money from their checking account at regular intervals using the ACH network.

It's a convenient alternative to other bill payment methods where the payer has to remember to mail a paper check, drop off cash, or pay with a card via the phone or online. With direct debit, the payer only needs to provide their bank details once. Then, they enter into a standing agreement for their bank account to be regularly debited once per a given time interval, without any further action on their end. Some common bills that are paid for with direct debit include software subscriptions, utility bills, and auto loans. It's an easy way to pay any bill that's regularly charged over a monthly, quarterly, semi-annually, or yearly basis. To sign up for direct debit for your garbage/sewer bill, please fill out the form on the next page and return it to the Village Hall along with a voided check.

**AUTHORIZATION AGREEMENT
DIRECT DEBIT PAYMENT PROGRAM
UTILITY BILLING SEWER/REFUSE**

I hereby authorize the Village of Willow Springs and the Financial Institution designated herein to begin deductions for Direct Debit in payment of my utility bill. I understand my automatic withdrawal of the billing amount will be made every two months on the bill's due date, as indicated on the statement received from the Village of Willow Springs.

I hereby agree to have such funds available on said due date as specified in this agreement, if funds are not available in my account on the payment date, the pre-authorized debit will be returned by my Financial Institution. I understand that if this occurs it will be handled as if I had a check returned for non-sufficient funds. I will be assessed a 10% penalty on the amount due and incur the relating \$35.00 returned check fee, as well as any charges issued by my Financial Institution.

This authority will remain in effect until the Village of Willow Springs has received written notification of termination at least 60 days prior to termination. I also agree to provide the Village of Willow Springs notification of any changes such as: a new bank, or change in checking or savings account status at least 60 days prior to changes.


